The author, a pediatric emergency physician, presents a captivating narrative of this successful campaign, questioning why such a cruel practice remained in place for so long. In doing so it serves as a case study of contemporary medical colonialism in Quebec. This book exposes the medical establishment's role in the displacement, colonization, and genocide of Indigenous Peoples in Canada. Sparked by the indifference and callousness of those in power, this book draws on the innovative work of Indigenous scholars and activists to conclude that a

broader decolonization struggle calling for reparations, land reclamation, and self-determination for Indigenous Peoples is critical to achieve reconciliation in Canada.
